6 months ago I called a Critical Resistance inmate hotline, built a friendship with a Professor whom in 50's has the voice of a 26 year old angelic being and have been in contact with students at the Claremont Colleges. Gen Z student body of 3 transgender males are part of team. I've even been delighted in making acquaintance with Maggie, a graduate student in upstate NY who identifies as Queer. These people exemplify what it means to be activist.

What have this diverse group accomplished? Besides befriending me, they've set up social media pages and even built a website. Many hands make light work.
